Dearest Friends,

What a wonderful time to live in Westwood!

When my family moved here in 2006, the business district was a very quiet place. Today, we have a bustling central district with regular public events, thriving businesses, and an inclusive, welcoming energy. This momentum has been the work of a dedicated, enthusiastic group of neighborhood

organizations, churches, businesses, investors, and neighbors putting their heads down and doing the hard work of believing in what could be. As our organization wrapped up 2022, I could not help but look back with immense gratitude for the opportunity that Westwood Works has had to play a part in this transformation.

Westwood Works started with a group of friends, a mural, and the first annual Westwood Art Show in 2009. Shortly after there was Treasure Quest and pop-up beer gardens. Westwood Works began producing regular events with Pop Goes Westwood in 2016. These tireless volunteers believed in the long-term vision of a lively, healthy, welcoming neighborhood for all, where families and friends could gather at community events.

Since then, a small part-time staff and an army of volunteers, funded by generous grants, sponsorships, and donations, have continued to bring free public events like the Westwood Art Show, Westwood Second Saturdays, Brews & Stews, Deck the Hall, Howl at the Hall, and numerous other smaller events to locations around Westwood. This year, Westwood Works produced the first-ever Pride event on the Westside of Cincinnati, collaborated with Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra to bring a performance to Mt. Airy, and welcomed the Cincinnati Shakespeare Company to Westwood Town Hall grounds for the first time.

You might ask, why are community events part of our mission, and why do they make such a difference to the health of a neighborhood?

Community events:

- Foster inspiration and forge connections between neighbors, friends, and local businesses.
- Activate public and private spaces to demonstrate what is possible in the community and promote small businesses.
- Improve the overall mental health and social capacity of the community by creating space for networking and connection.
- Showcase the diversity and inclusivity of a community through live music, art, and food that highlights cultural diversity and welcomes all neighbors

These ideals continue to be at the center of every event we plan.

Six years ago, Westwood Works continued its mission to forge meaningful connections by creating a mini-grant program. The intention of this program was to provide support and funding to neighbors who had dreams for Westwood and to help make those dreams a reality. Mini grants can fund new programs, crime/safety initiatives, beautification, business development, events, or whatever creative ideas our neighbors come up with. In 2022, we experienced record demand for mini grants with nineteen applications and were able to fund ten unique projects. To date, the mini grant program has provided over \$25,000 in funding for projects in Westwood.

This work is made possible by those that believe in Westwood and Westwood Works. On behalf of myself and our Board of Directors, to our fellow neighborhood organizations, our partners, sponsors, funders, donors, and volunteers, we extend our deepest appreciation. We remain steadfastly dedicated to the mission as we go forward in 2023 to forge connections and foster a spirit of acceptance, inclusiveness, and community that attracts neighbors and businesses from all walks of life to Westwood.



Westwood Second Saturday - Pride

In June 2022 we produced the first ever Pride event on the Westside. With record-breaking attendance, it was an evening of celebration in support of our friends and neighbors in the LGBTQ community. The event included live music, stand-up comedy, performances, vendors and food trucks from local LGBTQ businesses, and a rainbow light installation on the facade of Westwood Town Hall.



Westwood Second Saturday – Revive

The health and wellness themed, Revive, focused on providing active experiences for community members of all ages. Guests could participate in a free yoga class on the lawn, learn to play gaga ball, take tango lessons with Northside Tango, learn taekwondo techniques, dance with Pones and Cincy Tap, or relax and enjoy the five live musical acts throughout the evening.



Westwood Second Saturday - Feast

In August, we rejoiced in the gathering of community to feast on local foods that ranged from Jamaican to wood-fired pizza. We partnered with Cincinnati Shakespeare Company to bring a full performance of Twelfth Night to the neighborhood. This was their first event on the Westside! The evening ended with a set from hip hop and rap local group Sons of Silverton.



The Westwood Art Show

For the 13th year in a row, artists and makers converged upon Westwood to celebrate all things art. The event hosted over 50 local, majority-female, or minority-owned small businesses with handmade and homemade items. Guests of all ages enjoyed activities, food trucks, and live music at this free and open-to-the-public celebration of local art.
